State Finals Preview: Gymnastics State Finals this Saturday

For the first time, nine teams will vie for championship honors as the 42nd Annual IHSAA Gymnastics State Finals will be contested Saturday at Worthen Arena on the campus of Ball State University in Muncie. Competition will begin at 1 pm ET following the opening ceremonies.

In the re-structured tournament format, nine teams now advance to the state finals for the first time - the top three from the three regional sites.



Top-ranked Valparaiso leads a group of five returning teams from last year's state finals. The Vikings easily won their own regional last weekend and will look to add to their state-best nine championships after finishing as the runner-up each of the last two years.

No. 2 Fort Wayne Bishop Dwenger, the state champ two years ago, ran away with the Huntington North regional a week ago while third-ranked Portage, the defending state champion, placed second to Valpo in the regional. The Indians won their first state crown since 1975 last year. Sixth-ranked Columbus North and No. 10 Columbus East finished 1-2 at the Columbus regional and round out the returnees.

Fourth-ranked Merrillville qualified for the team competition for the first time in 12 years while No. 12 Connersville placed its team in the state finals 25 years after its last state title in 1989. Jay County is sending a team to the state finals for the first time in school history.

The all-around winners last weekend include Morgan Township sophomore Kylee Maxwell at Valpo, Hamilton senior Alex Cool at Huntington North, and Columbus North sophomore Katrina May at Columbus East.

Alex Nickel is the lone competitor this weekend with an individual championship to her credit. She won the bars and beam in 2012 as is one of 34 competing for all-around

honors on Saturday. She captured the bars and floor exercise at the Huntington North regional.
