Tournament History

Many changes have been made to the Indiana state wrestling tournament since its inception, and to this day it remains one of the most exciting and best-attended state finals event.

While not officially sponsored by the IHSAA, but held with special permission, the first state high school wrestling tournament took place in 1922 at Indiana University. A total of 19 wrestlers from seven schools participated in the first tournament. From 1922 to 1935, a regulation high school wrestling match called for one eight-minute period with both wrestlers starting in the neutral position on their feet. No point system was in place, and the winner was determined solely on riding time or by a fall. For the 1935-36 season, a point system was installed and periods were added to make the matches more interesting for fans.

From 1922 to 1951, the only IHSAA rules for wrestling were the same ones that applied to all sports in the state, mainly eligibility and age requirements. During this time, so-called gentlemen's agreements were decided upon before meets by the coaches and these rules were enforced by the officials.

A new set of rules, written by coaches Chauncey McDaniel of Southport High School and Clifford Myers of Bloomington High School, were adopted by the IHSAA beginning with the 1951-52 season. Modifications in the standing rules, most notably those that helped to prevent excessive weight loss, were made in time for the 1957-58 wrestling season. Finally in 1973, using Indiana's rules as a measuring stick, the National Wrestling Federation Rules were written and adopted.

Due to the sport's rapid growth, the IHSAA took over sponsorship of the tournament from 1933 to 1943, though the state finals were still held at Indiana University. However, as the Great Depression gripped the country and the United States entered World War II, there was a gradual decline in the number of schools participating. That forced the IHSAA to drop wrestling from its sponsorship from 1944 to 1949. During this period, various participating schools kept the tournament going by holding an annual invitational state tournament.

The IHSAA resumed sponsorship of the tournament in 1950 and continues to do so today. From 1950 to 1959, Bloomington and Lafayette Jefferson high schools alternated as the host school before the finals were moved in 1960 to Southport High School's 7,200-seat fieldhouse.

The finals eventually required even more seating and from 1981 to 1999 were held at Market Square Arena in Indianapolis before moving to Conseco Fieldhouse in 2000. Over the last 80 years, the wrestling tournament has grown from a two-day event in the early years to one that consists of separate team and individual competitions over a four-week period, including 64 sectionals, 16 regionals, four semi-states and the state finals.

In 1996, individual champions in each weight class and a team champion were crowned for the first time on separate weekends. The IHSAA individual wrestling tournament has been conducted under its usual format with the state finals culminating at Conseco Fieldhouse. The team tournament calls for the sectional champions to advance to eight, four-team regionals; winners at the eight regional sites advance to the state finals at Center Grove High School.

Last Week's Individual State Finals

CROWN POINT WRESTLERS PULL OUT THREE STATE TITLES

Crown Point came away the big winner Saturday night with three of its wrestlers winning state championships during the 71st Annual IHSAA Individual Wrestling State Finals at Consecro Fieldhouse in Indianapolis.

Junior Anthony Hawkins (42-0) and senior Marcus Shrewsbury (42-0) both remained unbeaten winning the 112 and 189 pound crowns, while freshman Jason Tsirtsis (40-2) won the 125 pound title. Hawkins defeated Roncalli's Josh Kieffer, 2-1, in overtime and Shrewsbury handled Northridge's Drew Graber, 6-3, in a battle of unbeaten. Tsirtsis, the younger brother of four-time state champion Alex Tsirtsis (2001-04), handled Indianapolis Cathedral's John Grey, 16-3.

The Crown Point trio became the third, fourth and fifth state champions in school history and the first ones since 1975. They'll compete with their teammates along with seven other teams during next Saturday's Team State Finals at Center Grove High School in Greenwood.

Also, Mishawaka's Steve Sandefer and Portage's Sean McMurray both won their second consecutive state titles. Sandefer (44-1), a senior, edged Elkhart Memorial's Ryan Stahl, 6-5, to repeat as 140 pound champ, while the junior McMurray won an 8-5 decision from Chesterton's Anthony Quiroz in the 152 championship. McMurray completed a 49-0 campaign after winning the 135 crown a year ago.

For the third year in a row, Anderson Highland senior Camden Eppert and Indianapolis Cathedral junior Brandon Wright squared off with a state championship at stake. The rubber match between the two went to Eppert (39-4) who took a 3-2 overtime decision in the 119 pound final. In their two previous state title bouts, Eppert took a 6-3 decision in 2007 at 103 and Wright triumphed 5-2 last year at 112.

Two Union County individuals also won championships as freshman Cody Phillips finished off a perfect season with an impressive pin just 2:34 into his 103 pound final

with Franklin's Dusty Kief. Junior Michael Duckworth (48-1), last year's runner-up at 160, claimed a 2-0 decision over Lawrence North's Bryce Grimes in the 171 final.

Four others polished off undefeated seasons.

The 145 pound championship went to Culver Academies senior Daniel Young (48-0) on a fall at the 5:32 mark of Indianapolis Cathedral's Gavin McGinley. He became his school's first wrestling state champion. Martinsville senior Briar Runyan (43-0) claimed an 8-3 decision from Pendleton Heights' Matt Todd at 160. Runyan was last year's runner-up at 152. Senior Billy Baker (42-0) of Belmont won a 4-1 decision over Mishawaka's Christian Lentz at 215 and Winchester senior Adam Chalfant (39-0) won his school's first title beating Mount Vernon's Alexander White, 7-2.

East Noble senior Taylor March (39-1) also won his school's first state championship with a 4-3 victory over Mitchell Richey of Brown County in the 135 bout. March had finished as a runner-up his first two years and placed third last season.

At 130, Hobart junior Francisco Porras (40-1) returned after last year's runner-up finish at 125 to capture the 130 title with a 4-1 win over D'Marcus Spencer of Pike.

Mishawaka's Josh Harper, who had battled a torn labrum in his left shoulder all season, lost his bid for a fourth state championship on Saturday. Harper gave up a 3-0 decision in the 130 semifinals to Spencer and ended his year 35-5 after finishing fourth.

Following the state tournament, the IHSAA Executive Committee named Taylor March of East Noble High School as the recipient of the Ward E. Brown Mental Attitude Award.

March capped his senior year as the 135 pound state champion and ends as his school's career wins leader with 163 victories. He had placed third at 125 last year and was runner-up at 119 in 2007 and runner-up at 112 in 2006.

MISHAWAKA CLAIMS SECOND WRESTLING STATE TITLE

In a rematch of last year's championship match, third-ranked Mishawaka knocked off two-time defending state champion and top ranked Evansville Mater Dei, 28-22, to claim its second wrestling state championship at Center Grove High School in Greenwood.

The state title is the first for Head coach Darrick Snyder, and the first for Mishawaka since 1991. After appearing in the state finals for nine consecutive seasons, the Cavemen avenged last year's 31-18 championship match defeat against the Wildcats.

The Cavemen (31-1) advanced to the championship round by defeating second-ranked Perry Meridian, 29-24, in a closely contested first round match-up. Mishawaka was led in the match by senior Brandon Straub who was a winner by fall in 1:59. In the second round, the Cavemen defeated Merrillville, 30-22, thanks to a fall by junior Steven Sandefer and a technical fall victory by senior Brandon Mersich.

The championship match began with the 135-pound class, where Evansville Mater Dei junior Adam Weinzapfel defeated Mishawaka junior Joey Smith, 7-4, to give the Wildcats an early 3-0 lead. Mishawaka re-claimed the lead when 160 lb. junior Tim Forte defeated Mater Dei junior Zach Easterling in a tight 1-0 match. The victory gave the Cavemen a 9-7 lead; one they would never relinquish. The Cavemen extended the margin with victories by 215 lb. senior Dave Balentine, 285 lb. senior Randy Morin, and 103 lb. sophomore Paul Beck, pushing their lead to 22-10. Evansville Mater Dei threatened by trimming the lead to 22-16 that featured back-to-back victories by 112 lb. senior Cody Moll and 119 lb. senior Alex Weinzapfel. Mishawaka was overcome with excitement when 125 lb. junior Josh Harper, a three-time individual champion, slammed the door on the Wildcats with a victory by fall over Mater Dei freshman John Sims. Harper's win sealed the match victory and the championship.

For 12-time champion, Evansville Mater Dei (23-2) and first year coach Greg Schaefer, it was their second runner-up finish (1987).



Mishawaka defeated Merrillville, 30-22, in the second round and second-ranked Perry Meridian, 29-24, in the semifinal round. The Cavemen then defeated Evansville Mater Dei in the championship match, 28-22, to claim their first team title since 1991.
