Roy joined the IHSAA Executive Staff in 1972 and administered the sport of girls basketball from the inception of the tournament series in 1976 until her retirement in 1999. The award was named in her honor beginning in 2000. Regarded both statewide and nationally as a pioneer in girls athletics, Roy served on the IHSAA Executive Staff longer than anyone in the history of the Association.

As the presenting partners of the state tournament, the Indiana Fever and Indiana Pacers, present a \$1,000 scholarship to the school in the name of the recipient.

IHSAA Girls Basketball Tournament Timeline

February 2, 1976: The IHSAA first sponsored a state tournament for girls basketball. Mirroring the boys state tournament, the format includes 64 sectionals, 16 regionals, four semi-states which feed into the state finals.

February 28, 1976: Warsaw tops Bloomfield, 57-52, to finish a perfect 22-0 in the first IHSAA girls basketball state championship game held at Hinkle Fieldhouse. A total of 360 teams are entered into the first state tournament with Bloomfield, East Chicago Roosevelt, Indianapolis Tech and Warsaw advancing to the state finals. Warsaw senior Judi Warren was selected as the mental attitude award winner. WRTV in Indianapolis televises all three games. Official attendance includes 7,362 for the championship game and 117,526 for the entire tournament.

February 26, 1977: LaTaunya Pollard of East Chicago Roosevelt scores a championship game record 36 points to lead the Rough Riders to a 66-35 victory over Mt. Vernon. An estimated 9,500 people turn out for the final game and 389 schools enter the sectional tournaments, 29 more than in 1976.

February 25, 1978: Warsaw defeats Jac-Cen-Del, 75-60, to become the first school to win two state championships. Head coach Janice Soyez also earns the distinction of becoming the first to win two championships. State championship game attendance increases again as 10,680 look on. A total of 392 teams are entered.

1979: First year the IHSAA Executive Committee presents medals to individuals participating in the state finals. Previously rings were presented to participants.

February 24, 1979: With its 48-23 victory over Anderson Madison Heights, East Chicago Roosevelt becomes the fourth consecutive unbeaten state champion and matches Warsaw with two state titles. The Rough Riders are coached by Roberta (Bobbie) DeKemper who also wins her second title as coach.

1980: First year the state championship trophy was presented in the shape of the state of Indiana.

February 23, 1980: First year the state finals are played at Market Square Arena in Indianapolis. The Southport Cardinals defeat Columbus East, 67-63, in the first state championship game determined in overtime. Columbus East guard Maria Stack sets a new championship game scoring record with 42 points as well as a two-game mark of 70.

January 26, 1981: A record 393 schools are entered into the state tournament.

February 27, 1982: In the first championship game featuring two unranked teams, Heritage downs Valparaiso, 52-45.

February 26, 1983: A record crowd of 13,704 sees Bedford North Lawrence survive a furious fourth-quarter rally by Crown Point to win the state championship, 55-50. Austin "Pete" Pritchett becomes the first man to coach a girls team to the state championship.

February 25, 1984: In the first Final Four featuring four top 10 teams, Crown Point, ranked No. 1 all season, emerges with a 55-54 overtime win over No. 5 Warren Central. Another record crowd of 13,722 turns out for the final game. Crown Point, which finishes 26-0, overcomes No. 2 Eastbrook in the semifinals, 56-50. It was the first meeting of the top two teams in state tournament history.

February 23, 1985: Crown Point, along with coach Tom May, becomes the first school to win back-to-back state titles with its 48-31 win over Wawasee. The Bulldogs become the first team to appear in three consecutive championship games and another record crowd of 14,197 attends the final.

February 28, 1987: Noblesville tops Olympic Conference rival Anderson Highland, 47-38, to win the state championship. It was the first state championship game featuring two teams from the same conference.

March 26, 1987: The three-point field goal is officially approved by the NFHS Basketball Rules Committee and will be introduced to the high school game beginning with the 1987-88 season.

February 27, 1988: A single session record 14,304 fans file in to Market Square Arena to see Fort Wayne Snider top defending state champion Noblesville, 60-58.

February 25, 1989: Scottsburg outlasts Benton Central in overtime, 74-72, before another championship game record crowd of 16,567.

February 24, 1990: Noblesville becomes the first school to reach the state finals in four consecutive years. The Millers are eliminated in the semifinals by eventual state champion Huntington North which won its first title. A winter storm mixture of heavy snow, ice and high winds forced an estimated 700 fans, mostly from Huntington North who had traveled to Indianapolis in fan buses, to spend the night at Market Square Arena.

February 29, 1992: Bedford North Lawrence becomes the second school (Crown Point) to advance to three consecutive state championship games but falls to Kokomo, 50-47, in the final game.

February 27, 1993: Kokomo turned back McCutcheon by a 70-60 score in the state championship game to become only the second school (Crown Point) in tournament history to record back-to-back championships. In its semifinal victory over Charlestown, Kokomo set a state finals record as all five starters scored in double figures.

February 26, 1994: Lake Central overcomes a 10-point, fourth quarter deficit to defeat Kokomo, 44-42, for its first state title. Kokomo was bidding to become the first school to win three consecutive state championships. Anderson, which fell to Kokomo, in the semifinals, was coached by Leah Wooldridge who became the first woman to play (Anderson Highland, 1987) and coach in the state finals.

February 25, 1995: In the second meeting between conference rivals with the state championship at stake, Huntington North bests Carmel, 43-39. The Vikings become the sixth school to win two state crowns. Carmel coach Judi Warren becomes the first woman to both play in a championship game (1976) and also coach in one. She also joins Leah Wooldridge, a starter on Anderson Highland's 1987 state runner-up team and the coach of Anderson's state semifinalist team in 1994, as the only women to play and coach in the Final Four.

April 29, 1996: Following more than two years of research and meetings by the Class Sports Study Committee, the IHSAA Board of Directors considers the committee's proposal, which calls for multiple-class formats in several sports, including basketball, and passes it 12-5 at its annual meeting on April 29. Implementation is scheduled for the 1997-98 school year.

September 17, 1996: In the first referendum of a Board of Directors decision in IHSAA history, the membership upholds the April 29, 1996 action by a margin of 220 to 157. Eight ballots are not received by the voting deadline and, as specified in the IHSAA By-Laws, a simple majority of the membership (193 of the 385 member schools) is needed to overturn the original vote.

March 1, 1997: Martinsville defeats Crown Point, 66-59, in the last single class state championship game.

April 9, 1997: As a compromise with opponents to the multiple class tournament format, the IHSAA Executive Committee adopts the "Tournament of Champions" pitting the four state championship teams into their own tournament the following weekend.

March 14, 1998: For the first time, the state tournament is separated into four different classes based on school enrollment as Martinsville (Class 4A), West Lafayette (3A), Southridge (2A) and Bloomfield (A) win their respective state championships.

March 21, 1998: Martinsville (Class 4A) defeats Southridge (Class 2A), 74-61, in the championship game of the Tournament of Champions at Hinkle Fieldhouse.

May 3, 1999: The IHSAA Executive Committee votes to eliminate the Tournament of Champions after two years effective with the 2000 state tournament.

March 4, 2000: The girls basketball state finals returns to Hinkle Fieldhouse for the first time since 1979.

March 3, 2001: First year the state finals are played at Conseco Fieldhouse in Indianapolis.

March 3, 2001: With its 55-39 win over Shenandoah for the 2A crown, Fort Wayne Bishop Luers becomes the first school to capture three consecutive state championships.

April 30, 2001: The IHSAA Board of Directors approved, effective 2003-2004, the ability of schools to play up one or more classification levels. Schools will be allowed to play in a higher classification in one or more sports while remaining in their natural classification in others. Schools which opt to play in a higher class must declare at the beginning of an enrollment classification cycle and stay in those classes through the entire cycle.

March 2, 2002: Fort Wayne Bishop Luers becomes the first school to win four consecutive state championships with a 51-37 win over Gibson Southern in the Class 3A state championship game. Bishop Luers' titles in the previous three years had come while in Class 2A.

March 4, 2006: Four years after its last crown, Fort Wayne Bishop Luers notches a record fifth title with a 65-54 victory over Evansville Memorial.

March 3, 2007: Oregon-Davis becomes the first school to sweep the girls and boys basketball state championships in the same school year winning both Class A crowns. The two teams win their respective state championships just three weeks apart. It's the first two state championships of any kind for the school located in Starke County.

March 1, 2008: The IHSAA's partner IHSAASports.org, a website run by Emmis Communications in Indianapolis, streams the state finals to the internet for the first time. All four games are available in live video and audio to anyone, anywhere.

March 7, 2009: Top-ranked Ben Davis (30-0) becomes the first girls basketball team to win 30 games in a season as sophomore Bria Goss banks home a driving runner in the lane with 1.4 seconds left to give the Giants a 71-69 win over No. 2 South Bend Washington for the Class 4A championship. The four state championship games are hosted in the new Lucas Oil Stadium in downtown Indianapolis for the first time. The 2009 state tournament draws a record 397 schools.

March 7, 2009: Heritage Christian matches Fort Wayne Bishop Luers (1999-2002) in winning its fourth consecutive state title. The Eagles outlast Oak Hill 60-58 in overtime for the Class 2A championship.

March 6, 2010: The girls basketball state finals are played at the Allen County Memorial Coliseum in Fort Wayne, the first time the event has been played outside of Indianapolis. Three Fort Wayne teams make up the field of eight with Fort Wayne Canterbury (1A) and Fort Wayne Concordia (3A) winning their respective championships. Fort Wayne Bishop Luers (2A) falls in overtime in its quest for a sixth crown. The 2010 tournament ties the record mark with 397 schools participating.

March 5, 2011: Fort Wayne Bishop Luers extends its own record with a sixth state championship following a 59-46 win over Brownstown Central in the 2A championship game. For the third consecutive year, a record 397 schools take part in the state tournament.

March 3, 2012: The four state championship games are contested at the Hulman Center in Terre Haute for the first time. A record number of teams – 398 – participate in the 2012 state tournament. For the first time, the IHSAA girls basketball state finals telecast is aired in high-definition via WTTV Indiana's 4 and the IHSAA Champions Network.

February 1, 2014: The IHSAA announces that the Indiana Fever and Indiana Pacers will become presenting sponsors of the state high school basketball tournaments. The Pacers and Fever become the first professional basketball franchises to partner with a state high school association and its tournaments.

March 8, 2014: The girls basketball state finals are televised on Fox Sports Indiana for the first time of a multi-year agreement.

March 7, 2015: Princeton's Jackie Young scores a record 36 points on 15-of-22 shooting from the field and grabbed 12 rebounds to boost the Tigers to a 72-44 victory over the Tippecanoe Valley Vikings. Young's 36 points represented a new standard for Class 3A -- and for all classes since the advent of the multiple-class system in 1997-98. Young, the state's leading scorer in 2014-15 with a 32.4 average, also surpassed the 1,000 mark totaling 1,003 points to become the first girl to reach that milestone and the fifth player in Indiana high school basketball history.

Feb. 26-27, 2021: Amid the COVID-19 global pandemic, the IHSAA Girls Basketball State Finals are successfully held on their regularly scheduled dates at Bankers Life Fieldhouse. Crown Point (4A), Silver Creek (3A), Linton-Stockton (2A) and Pioneer (A) win their respective state championships. Each game is played before limited spectators with each school allotted just 1,000 tickets. With the exception of players in the game, all individuals are required to wear face masks or face coverings. All seats, including team benches, are arranged to be socially distanced throughout the facility. After the awards ceremony for each game, the venue is cleared of spectators and cleaned before fans for the ensuing game are allowed inside.
