Attorney Robert Baker updated the Executive Committee on the current status of pending litigation against the Association.

PENALTIES ASSESSED

Calumet High School – (Cross country runner participated in IHSAA sectional event without participating in the minimum number of regular season contests). Commissioner Cox reported the following action as a result of a violation of Rule 101-4.

1. The Calumet High School girls' cross country program is issued a warning.
2. Coach Rob Lukowski is reprimanded for permitting this violation to occur.
3. The ineligible athlete is disqualified from the IHSAA cross country tournament series.
4. In accordance with rule 3-9-4b of the IHSAA By-Laws, the ineligible athlete shall be removed from the results and team scores shall be refigured for the Hammond Gavit girls' cross country sectional.

Carroll (Flora) High School – (Cross country runner participated in a road race without an approved waiver).

Commissioner Cox reported the following action as a result of a violation of Rule 15-1.1a.

1. The Carroll (Flora) High School boys' cross country program is issued a warning.
2. The student athlete involved in this violation shall be suspended for two contests for violating Rule 15-1.1a. Contests already served as suspension for this violation shall meet said penalty.

Corydon Central High School – (Cross country teams conducted a training run on Sunday with the coach present).

Commissioner Cox reported the following action as a result of a violation of Rule 9-13.

1. The Corydon Central High School boys' and girls' cross country teams are issued a warning.
2. Coach Derrick Singleton is reprimanded for causing this violation to occur.

DeKalb High School – (Football player participated in several varsity contests prior to an athletic transfer report being approved). Commissioner Cox reported the following action as a result of a violation of Rule 19-3.

1. The DeKalb High School football program is issued a warning.
2. Coach Mike Cochran is reprimanded for causing this violation to occur.
3. In accordance with Rule 3-9, DeKalb High School shall notify all schools where the violations occurred and forfeit the games if DeKalb was victorious.

Fishers High School – (Cross country runner participated in an open cross country race without an approved waiver). Commissioner Cox reported the following action as a result of a violation of Rule 15-1.1a.

1. The Fishers High School boys' cross country program is issued a warning.
2. The student athlete involved in this violation shall be suspended for two contests for violating Rule 15-1.1a. Contests already served as suspension for this violation shall meet said penalty.

Gary Lighthouse High School – (A student not enrolled at the school participated in a football contest). Commissioner Cox reported the following action as a result of a violation of Rule 12-1.

1. The Gary Lighthouse Academy football program is issued a warning.
2. The school against whom this athlete competed must be notified of this rules violation and the game shall be forfeited if Gary Lighthouse Academy was victorious.

Indianapolis Arlington High School – (Three football players were allowed to participate prior to being certified academically eligible - PROBATION). Commissioner Cox reported the following action as a result of a violation of Rule 3-9.4.

1. The Indianapolis Arlington High School football program is placed on probation. This probation is a severe type of warning. It is official notice that serious violations have occurred, are a matter of record and future, similar incidents will not be tolerated.
2. Coach Jonas Williams is severely reprimanded for permitting this violation to occur. Defiance of a directive issued by a school administrator is unacceptable on any level and intentionally violating IHSAA by-laws will not be tolerated any further.
3. The suspension of Coach Williams issued by Indianapolis Arlington High School is supported by the IHSAA as an appropriate penalty.
4. In accordance with rule 3-9 of the IHSAA By-Laws, Indianapolis Arlington High School shall notify the opposing school that this violation has occurred and if Indianapolis Arlington was victorious, the contest shall be forfeited.

Indianapolis Metropolitan High School – (Boys' soccer player participated in sectional while not being entered on sectional entry list). Commissioner Cox reported the following action as a result of a violation of Rule 3-9.4.

1. The Indianapolis Metropolitan High School boys' soccer program is issued a warning.
2. Coach Tom Loughead is reprimanded for allowing this violation to occur. It is imperative that the head coach confirms an accurate entry list with his school administration prior to the beginning of any IHSAA tournament series event.
3. It is strongly suggested that future sectional entry lists be reviewed with the utmost care and posted conspicuously in locker rooms for student athletes to review before submission to the IHSAA.

Indianapolis Washington High School - (Four boys' soccer players participated in sectional while not being entered on sectional entry list). Commissioner Cox reported the following action as a result of a violation of Rule 3-9.4.

1. The Indianapolis George Washington Community High School boys' soccer program is issued a warning.
2. Coach Juan Santos is reprimanded for allowing this violation to occur. It is imperative that the head coach confirms an accurate entry list with his school administration prior to the beginning of any IHSAA tournament series event.
3. The Commissioner's office will allow these student athletes to participate in the boys' soccer tournament under the provisions of Rule 16-3 of the IHSAA by-laws provided that the school pays a \$200 fee to add the name of Jario Castanon who played in the IHSAA boys' soccer sectional on Monday, October 3, 2011 and another \$200.00 fee to add the names of Adonnis Kimbrough, Moises Valdivia and Willie Whitescarver who played in the IHSAA boys' soccer sectional on Wednesday, October 5, 2011. Failure to submit this penalty will render the students in question ineligible for future tournament participation during the 2011 tournament series.
4. It is strongly suggested that future sectional entry lists be reviewed with the utmost care and posted conspicuously in locker rooms for student athletes to review before submission to the IHSAA.

Lafayette Jefferson High School – (Football player participated in several junior varsity contests prior to an athletic transfer report being approved). Commissioner Cox reported the following action as a result of a violation of Rule 19-3.

1. The Lafayette Jefferson High School football program is issued a warning.

2. Coach Andy Kennedy is reprimanded for causing this violation to occur.
3. In accordance with Rule 3-9, Lafayette Jefferson High School shall notify all schools where the violations occurred and forfeit the games if Lafayette Jefferson was victorious.

Lawrenceburg High School – (Girls' cross country runner participated in a contest without the requisite number of practices completed). Commissioner Cox reported the following action as a result of a violation of Rule 101-1.2.

1. The Lawrenceburg High School girls' cross country program is issued a warning.
2. The Lawrenceburg team score in the EIAC meet shall be reconfigured after removing the ineligible athlete from the team score total. Lawrenceburg High School shall notify all members of the EIAC of this violation and new team score.

Monroe Central High School – (Football player participated in multiple contests without an approved transfer).

Commissioner Cox reported the following action as a result of a violation of Rule 19-3.

1. The Monroe Central High School football program is issued a warning.
2. Coach Trent Fine is reprimanded for causing this violation to occur.
3. In accordance with Rule 3-9, Monroe Central High School shall notify all schools where the violations occurred and forfeit the games if Monroe Central was victorious.

North Daviess High School – (Volleyball players participated in more than five sets across two levels of competition in the same tournament). Commissioner Cox reported the following action as a result of a violation of Rule 111-4.

1. The North Daviess High School volleyball program is issued a warning.
2. Coach Ruth Ann Burkhart is reprimanded for permitting this violation to occur.
3. The five sets shall count as two matches toward the maximum number of matches allowed in a season for the student athletes involved in this rule violation.
4. In accordance with rule 3-9 of the IHSAA By-Laws, North Daviess High School shall notified the other participating schools that this violation has occurred and the matches in which North Daviess was victorious in shall be forfeited.

Park Tudor High School – (Non-school participants engaged in school sponsored open facility programming with enrolled students – PROBATION). Commissioner Cox reported the following action as a result of a violation of Rule 15-2.5.

1. The Park Tudor boys' basketball program is placed on probation for the 2011-12 season. This probation is a severe type of warning. It is official notice that serious violations have occurred, are a matter of record and future, similar incidents will not be tolerated.
2. Coach Ed Schilling is reprimanded for allowing these violations to occur.
3. Park Tudor boys' basketball open facility programs are to be terminated immediately. Open facility programs for the boys' basketball program may commence once again after the 2011-12 boys' basketball season as per the provisions of the IHSAA by-laws.

Richmond High School – (Football player returned to competition without the required number of practices accomplished after an injury). Commissioner Cox reported the following action as a result of a violation of Rule 9-14 and 3-11.

1. The Richmond High School football program is issued a warning.
2. Coach Eric Gillespie is reprimanded for causing this violation to occur
3. In accordance with Rule 3-9, Richmond High School shall notify Muncie Central High School of this violation and forfeit the game if Richmond was victorious.

Richmond High School – (Football player participated in a junior varsity contest prior to an athletic transfer report being approved). Commissioner Cox reported the following action as a result of a violation of Rule 19-3.

1. The Richmond High School football program is issued a warning.
2. Coach Eric Gillespie is reprimanded for causing this violation to occur.
3. In accordance with Rule 3-9, Richmond High School shall notify Huntington North High School of this violation and forfeit the game if Richmond was victorious.

Rossville High School – (Girls' soccer player participated in multiple matches while academically ineligible).

Commissioner Cox reported the following action as a result of a violation of Rule 18-1.

1. The Rossville High School girls' soccer program is issued a warning.
2. The student athlete involved in this violation shall be suspended and declared ineligible for further competition until he meets the minimum standards for academic eligibility.
3. In accordance with Rule 3-9 of the IHSAA By-Laws, Rossville High School shall notify all schools of this violation in matches where the ineligible student participated and the contests where the ineligible athlete participated shall be forfeited if Rossville was victorious.

Sheridan High School – (Girls' soccer player participated in multiple matches while academically ineligible).
Commissioner Cox reported the following action as a result of a violation of Rule 18-1.

1. The Sheridan High School girls' soccer program is issued a warning.
2. The student athlete involved in this violation shall be suspended and declared ineligible for further competition until he meets the minimum standards for academic eligibility.
3. In accordance with Rule 3-9 of the IHSAA By-Laws, Sheridan High School shall notify all schools of this violation in matches where the ineligible student participated and the contests where the ineligible athlete participated shall be forfeited if Sheridan was victorious.

Union (Dugger) High School – (Volleyball players participated in six sets across two levels of competition in the same tournament). Commissioner Cox reported the following action as a result of a violation of Rule 111-4.

1. The Union (Dugger) High School volleyball program is issued a warning.
2. Coach Danielle Gentry is reprimanded for permitting this violation to occur.
3. The five sets shall count as two matches toward the maximum number of matches allowed in a season for the student athletes involved in this rule violation.
4. In accordance with rule 3-9 of the IHSAA By-Laws, Union (Dugger) High School shall notified the other participating schools that this violation has occurred and the matches in which Union (Dugger) was victorious in shall be forfeited.
