APPROVAL FOR EXECUTIVE STAFF AND BOARD MEMBERS TO ATTEND 94th NFHS SUMMER CONFERENCE

Commissioner Cox requested permission for the executive staff and the Board of Directors to attend the annual meeting of the National Federation of State High School Associations, June 24-29, 2013. A motion to approve this request was made by Mike Broughton; seconded by Steve Cox; motion passed 19-0.

2012-13 GYMNASTICS TOURNAMENT UPDATE

Assistant Commissioner Walter presented plans for the gymnastics tournament series that deviated from the original tournament format. This change is due to a shortage of gymnastics judges.

FOOTBALL COACHES RULES COMMITTEE REPORT

Assistant Commissioner Faulkens presented relevant details of the recent NFHS Football Committee Rules Meeting.

Three additional rules will take effect next season to address helmets coming off players' heads during games:

1. An illegal personal contact foul was added to Rule 9-4-3 to state that no player or non-player shall initiate contact with an opposing player whose helmet has come completely off.
2. A new listing in Rule 9-6-4 will state that it is illegal participation for a player whose helmet comes completely off during a down to continue to participate beyond the immediate action in which the player is engaged.
3. The committee also added language to Rule 3-5-10 to clarify that if the helmet comes completely off during the down or subsequent dead-ball action related to the down – and is not directly attributable to a foul by the opponent – the player must leave the game for at least one down, with the exception of halftime or overtime intermission.

When this occurs, an official's time-out shall be called.

The most significant rules change next season will be one that reduces the penalty for pass interference. While the 15-yard penalty will remain for both offensive and defensive pass interference, the loss of down has been removed for offensive pass interference and the automatic first down has been eliminated for defensive pass interference.

Another change at high school football games next year will be the expanded use of communication devices. In specific situations, coaches, players and non-players will be allowed to use any form of communication technology.

This expansion of the rule allows the use of communication devices during authorized conferences outside the nine-yard marks, on the sidelines and during the halftime intermission. Use of communication devices by players except conferences outside the nine-yard mark continues to be prohibited.

LEGISLATIVE UPDATE

Commissioner Cox reported on the bills that have been submitted to the legislature.

PENALTIES ASSESSED

The following penalties were assessed for various violations of the IHSAA By-Laws:

Attica High School - Commissioner Cox reported the following action as a result of a violation of Rules 14-1 (*School used an unlicensed official to officiate a swimming and diving meet*).

1. The Attica High School boys' and girls' swimming and diving programs are issued a warning.
2. In accordance with Rule 3-9 of the IHSAA By-Laws, Southmont High School shall be notified of this rule violation and if Attica High School was victorious, the meet(s) shall be forfeited.

Batesville High School - Commissioner Cox reported the following action as a result of a violation of Rule 15-2.4c(3) and 15-3.1a (*Football coach was mandating attendance at during the school year out of season and summer activities*).

1. The Batesville High School football program is issued a warning.
2. Coach Eric Heppner is reprimanded for allowing these violations to occur.
3. The IHSAA supports the actions of the Batesville High School administration in the corrective measures already placed in this matter.

Charlestown High School - Commissioner Cox reported the following action as a result of a violation of Rule 3-10 (*Boys' basketball player participated in two contests without a pre-participation physical and consent on file*).

1. The Charlestown High School boys' basketball program is issued a warning.
2. This is a health and safety issue and it is absolutely mandatory that the "IHSAA Pre-Participation Physical and Consent Form" be on file at the school for every student athlete prior to any practice let alone an interscholastic competition.
3. The contests in which the ineligible athlete participated shall be forfeited if Charlestown was victorious and the opposing schools shall be notified of this violation.

Columbus North South Side High School - Commissioner Cox reported the following action as a result of a violation of Rule 3-10 (*Girls' diver participated in a meet without a pre-participation and consent on file*).

1. The Columbus North High School girls' swimming and diving program is issued a warning.
2. This is a health and safety issue and it is absolutely mandatory that the "IHSAA Pre-Participation Physical and Consent Form" be on file at the school for every student athlete prior to any practice let alone an interscholastic competition.
3. The contests in which the ineligible athlete participated shall be rescored to remove the points earned by the ineligible athlete and the team scores recalculated for any meet where the ineligible athlete participated.

Delphi High School - Commissioner Cox reported the following action as a result of a violation of Rule 19-3 (*Wrestler participated in multiple contests without an approved transfer report on file*).

1. The Delphi High School wrestling program is issued a warning.

2. It is absolutely mandatory that the "IHSAA Transfer Report" be submitted and acted upon by the Association prior to a student being allowed to participate in any interscholastic event.
3. As per Rule 3-9 of the IHSAA by-laws, the meets in which the ineligible athlete participated in shall be re-scored to remove any points earned by the ineligible athlete and the opposing schools notified of this violation.

East Noble High School - Commissioner Cox reported the following action as a result of a violation of Rule 19-3 (*Foreign exchange student participated in several meets without an approved foreign exchange eligibility report on file*).

1. The East Noble High School girls' swimming and diving program is issued a warning.
2. It is absolutely mandatory that the "IHSAA Foreign Exchange Report" be submitted and acted upon by the Association prior to a student being allowed to participate in any interscholastic event.
3. As per Rule 3-9 of the IHSAA by-laws, the meets in which the ineligible athlete participated in shall be re-scored to remove any points earned by the ineligible athlete and the opposing schools notified of this violation.

Garrett High School - Commissioner Cox reported the following action as a result of a violation of Rule 3-8 (*Wrestler with limited eligibility participated in multiple varsity contests*).

1. The Garrett High School wrestling program is issued a warning.
2. The contests in which the student participated at the varsity level shall be rescored to reflect forfeits in each match and Garrett High School shall notify all affected schools of this violation.
3. The student athlete is remanded to junior varsity participation until such time his limited eligibility expires.

Gary Lighthouse High School - Commissioner Cox reported the following action as a result of a violation of Rule 19-3 (*Two boys' basketball players participated in multiple contests without approved transfer reports on file*).

1. The Gary Lighthouse High School boys' basketball program is issued a warning.
2. It is absolutely mandatory that the "IHSAA Transfer Report" be submitted and acted upon by the Association prior to a student being allowed to participate in any interscholastic event.
3. As per Rule 3-9 of the IHSAA by-laws, the games in which the ineligible athlete participated in shall be forfeited if Gary Lighthouse was victorious and the opposing schools notified of this violation.

Gary Wallace High School - Commissioner Cox reported the following action as a result of a violation of Rule 3-10 and 9-14 (*Girls' basketball player participated in multiple contests without a pre-participation physical and consent on file and participated in said contests without the requisite number of practices - PROBATION*).

1. The Gary Wallace girls' basketball program is placed on probation. This probation is a severe type of warning. It is official notice that serious violations have occurred, are a matter of record and future, similar incidents will not be tolerated. This probation shall last throughout the remainder of the current season.
2. This is a health and safety issue and it is absolutely mandatory that the "IHSAA Pre-Participation Physical and Consent Form" be on file at the school for every student athlete prior to any practice let alone an interscholastic competition. It is also a health and safety consideration allowing a student to complete a minimum number of practices after an extended absence from the team.
3. The contests in which the ineligible athlete participated shall be forfeited if Gary Wallace was victorious and the opposing schools shall be notified of this violation.

Noblesville High School - Commissioner Cox reported the following action as a result of a violation of Rule 15-1.2a (*Boys' basketball player participated in a non-school sponsored contest during the authorized contest season without an approved waiver*).

1. The Noblesville High School boys' basketball program is issued a warning.
2. The student athlete involved in this violation shall be suspended for the next two games on the Noblesville High School regular season schedule.

South Bend Adams High School - Commissioner Cox reported the following action as a result of a violation of Rule 3-10 (*Student participated in boys swimming practices without a pre-participation physical and consent on file*).

1. The South Bend Adams High School boys' swimming and diving program is issued a warning.
2. It is absolutely mandatory that the "IHSAA Pre-Participation Physical and Consent Form" be on file at the school for every student athlete prior to any practice.

3. The proper collection of completed physical and consent forms addresses the health and safety of all student athletes choosing to participate in the interscholastic program.
4. The IHSAA strongly advises South Bend Adams High School to critically review their procedures regarding the administration of the Association's rules and implement systemic changes to improve these protocols at the school.

South Bend Adams High School - Commissioner Cox reported the following action as a result of a violation of Rule 19-3 (*Students participated in multiple sports and contests without an approved transfer report on file*).

1. The South Bend Adams High School boys' cross country, boys' track and field and wrestling programs are issued a warning.
2. It is absolutely mandatory that the "IHSAA Transfer Report" be submitted and acted upon by the Association prior to a student being allowed to participate in any interscholastic event.
3. As per Rule 3-9 of the IHSAA by-laws, the meets in which the ineligible athlete participated in shall be re-scored to remove any points earned by the ineligible athlete and the opposing schools notified of these violations.
4. The IHSAA strongly advises South Bend Adams High School to critically review their procedures regarding the administration of the Association's transfer rules and implement systemic changes to improve these protocols at the school.

Union (Dugger) High School - Commissioner Cox reported the following action as a result of a violation of Rule 52-3 (*Boys' basketball player participated in six quarters in a single session*).

1. The Union High School boys' basketball program is issued a warning.
2. All six quarters shall count against the maximum number of quarters allowed for the student athlete involved in this violation.
3. In accordance with Rule 3-9, Hustonville High School shall be notified of this violation and if Union High School was victorious, the varsity game shall be forfeited.

Warren Central High School - Commissioner Cox reported the following action as a result of a violation of Rule 19-3 (*Girls' basketball player participated in multiple contests without an approved transfer report on file*).

1. The Warren Central High School girls' basketball program is issued a warning.
2. It is absolutely mandatory that the "IHSAA Transfer Report" be submitted and acted upon by the Association prior to a student being allowed to participate in any interscholastic event.
3. As per Rule 3-9 of the IHSAA by-laws, the games in which the ineligible athlete participated in shall be forfeited if Warren Central was victorious and the opposing schools notified of this violation.

Winchester High School - Commissioner Cox reported the following action as a result of a violation of Rule 9-13 (*Multiple girls' basketball players watched film with coaching staff on Sunday*).

1. The Winchester Community High School girls' basketball program is issued a warning.
2. Head Coach Ed Gessaman and Assistant Coach Mark Haney are reprimanded for this violation. It is particularly troubling that these coaches in all likelihood knew that this action violated IHSAA by-laws yet allowed this to occur.
3. Head Coach Ed Gessaman is suspended from the opening game of the 2013 IHSAA girls' sectional basketball tournament. Coach Gessaman is to have no contact with the team from the conclusion of school on Tuesday, February 5, 2013 until the players vacate the sectional venue.
4. Should the Winchester girls' team advance in the sectional beyond their opening game, Coach Mark Haney is suspended from the second game of the 2013 IHSAA girls' sectional basketball tournament. Should Winchester be defeated in the opening game of the sectional, Coach Haney shall be suspended from the first regular season contest of the 2013-14 season. Coach Haney is to have no contact with the team from the conclusion of school on the date of suspension until the players vacate the venue after the contest.
5. The IHSAA supports additional measures of correction instituted by Winchester Community High School as remedy for this infraction.
