PENALTIES ASSESSED

Bethany Christian High School – (*Boys' soccer player participated in multiple matches without an approved transfer report on file*). Commissioner Cox reported the following action as a result of a violation of Rule 19-3.

1. The Bethany Christian High School boys' soccer program is issued a warning.
2. The student athlete involved in this violation shall be suspended and declared ineligible until an approved transfer report is on file.
3. The contests in which the ineligible athlete participated shall be forfeited if Bethany Christian was victorious and the opposing schools shall be notified of this violation.

Bethany Christian High School – (*Girls' soccer player participated in multiple matches without an approved transfer report on file*). Commissioner Cox reported the following action as a result of a violation of Rule 19-3.

1. The Bethany Christian High School girls' soccer program is issued a warning.
2. The student athlete involved in this violation shall be suspended and declared ineligible until an approved transfer report is on file.
3. The contests in which the ineligible athlete participated shall be forfeited if Bethany Christian was victorious and the opposing schools shall be notified of this violation.

Bloomington North High School – (*Boys' track coach conducted a workout on Sunday*). Commissioner Cox reported the following action as a result of a violation of Rule 9-13.

1. The Bloomington High School North boys' track and field program is issued a warning.
2. Coach Ernie Clark is reprimanded for this violation. Ignorance of the rules is not an acceptable reason for a rules violation.
3. The IHSAA accepts and supports the corrective actions of Bloomington High School North as appropriate measures in this matter.

Charlestown High School – (*Girls' soccer player participated in multiple matches without an approved transfer report*). Commissioner Cox reported the following action as a result of a violation of Rule 19-3.

1. The Charlestown High School girls' soccer program is issued a warning.
2. The student athlete involved in this violation shall be suspended and declared ineligible until an approved transfer report is on file.
3. The contests in which the ineligible athlete participated shall be forfeited if Charlestown was victorious and the opposing schools shall be notified of this violation.

Elkhart Central High School – (*Football players participated in multiple games without approved transfer reports on file*). Commissioner Cox reported the following action as a result of a violation of Rule 19-3.

1. The Elkhart Central High School football program is issued a warning.
2. The student athletes involved in this violation shall be suspended and declared ineligible until approved transfer reports are on file.
3. The contests in which the ineligible athletes participated shall be forfeited if Elkhart Central was victorious. The opposing schools shall be notified of this violation.

Evansville Reitz Memorial High School – (*Girls' soccer team participated in more than the allowable amount of season contests*). Commissioner Cox reported the following action as a result of a violation of Rule 106-3.

1. The Evansville Reitz Memorial High School girls' soccer program is issued a warning.
2. Coach Angie Lensing and Athletic Director Bruce Dockery are reprimanded for permitting this violation to occur. A lack of attention to the rules is not an acceptable explanation for a rules violation.
3. The contest in which the violation occurred shall be forfeited and the opposing school notified accordingly.
4. The 2014-15 girls' soccer schedule of Evansville Reitz Memorial High School shall be reduced to a maximum of 15 team contests or 13 team contests and one tournament. Exceeding this limitation for the 2014-15 season may result in severe penalties.

Glenn High School – (*Football player participated in multiple games while academically ineligible*). Commissioner Cox reported the following action as a result of a violation of Rule 18-1.

1. The Glenn football program is issued a warning.
2. The student involved in this violation is declared ineligible until such time the student may become academically eligible.
3. The interscholastic contests in which the ineligible athlete participated in shall be forfeited if Glenn was victorious. The opposing schools shall be made aware of this violation.

Glenn High School – (*Football player participated in multiple games without an approved transfer report on file*). Commissioner Cox reported the following action as a result of a violation of Rule 19-3.

1. The Glenn football program is issued a warning.

2. The student involved in this violation is declared ineligible until such time the student may become academically eligible.
3. The interscholastic contests in which the ineligible athlete participated in shall be forfeited if Glenn was victorious. The opposing schools shall be made aware of this violation.

Hamilton Heights High School – (*Girls' soccer player participated in a sectional contest without being entered on the official sectional entry list*). Commissioner Cox reported the following action as a result of a violation of Rule 3-9.4.

1. The Hamilton Heights High School girls' soccer program is issued a warning.
2. Coach Travis Kauffman is reprimanded for allowing this violation to occur. It is imperative that the head coach confirms an accurate entry list with his school administration prior to the beginning of any IHSAA tournament series event.
3. The Commissioner's office will allow this student to participate in the girls' soccer tournament under the provisions of Rule 16-3 of the IHSAA by-laws provided that the school pays a \$200 fee to add the name of Haley Hiatt who played in the IHSAA girls' soccer sectional while not listed on the official entry list for this sport. Failure to submit this penalty will render the student in question ineligible for future tournament participation during the 2013 tournament series.
4. It is strongly suggested that future sectional entry lists be reviewed with the utmost care and posted conspicuously in locker rooms for student athletes to review before submission to the IHSAA.

Hammond Bishop Noll High School - (*Volleyball player participated in a tryout for a non-school sponsored team during the authorized contest season*). Commissioner Cox reported the following action as a result of a violation of Rule 15-1.2g.

1. The Hammond Bishop Noll High School volleyball program is issued a warning.
2. The student athlete involved in this violation shall be suspended for two matches on the Hammond Bishop Noll High School regular season schedule.

Indianapolis Cathedral High School – (*Boys' soccer player participated in multiple matches while academically ineligible*). Commissioner Cox reported the following action as a result of a violation of Rule 18-1.

1. The Indianapolis Cathedral boys' soccer program is issued a warning.
2. The student involved in this violation is declared ineligible until such time the student may become academically eligible.
3. The interscholastic contests in which the ineligible athlete participated in shall be forfeited if Indianapolis Cathedral was victorious. The opposing schools shall be made aware of this violation.

Indianapolis Crispus Attucks High School – (*Girls' cross country runner participated in two meets without an approved transfer report on file*). Commissioner Cox reported the following action as a result of a violation of Rule 19-1.

1. The Indianapolis Crispus Attucks High School girls' cross country program is issued a warning.
2. The student athlete involved in this violation shall be suspended and declared ineligible an approved transfer report is on file.
3. The contests in which the ineligible athlete participated shall be rescored to remove any points earned by the ineligible athlete. The opposing schools shall be notified of this violation.

Indianapolis Emmerich Manual High School – (*Volleyball player participated in multiple matches without an approved transfer report on file*). Commissioner Cox reported the following action as a result of a violation of Rule 19-3.

1. The Indianapolis Emmerich Manual High School volleyball program is issued a warning.
2. The student athlete involved in this violation shall be suspended and declared ineligible an approved transfer report is on file.
3. The contests in which the ineligible athlete participated shall be forfeited if Emmerich Manual was victorious. The opposing schools shall be notified of this violation.

Lebanon High School – (*Student participated in multiple cross country meets without an approved transfer report on file*). Commissioner Cox reported the following action as a result of a violation of Rule 19-3.

1. The Lebanon High School boys' cross country program is issued a warning.

2. The student athlete involved in this violation shall be suspended and declared ineligible an approved transfer report is on file.
3. The contests in which the ineligible athlete participated shall be rescored to remove any points earned by the ineligible athlete. The opposing schools shall be notified of this violation.

NorthWood High School – (*Boys’ soccer player participated in multiple matches while academically ineligible and without an approved transfer report on file*). Commissioner Cox reported the following action as a result of a violation of Rule 18-1 and 19-3.

1. The NorthWood High School boys’ soccer program is issued a warning.
2. The student shall be declared ineligible until the student successfully completes academic requirements at the school upon the next certification date.
3. An approved IHSAA transfer report must be on file for any student that transfers into a member school prior to participation in an interscholastic contest.
4. The interscholastic contests in which the ineligible athlete participated shall be forfeited if NorthWood was victorious. The opposing schools shall be made aware of this violation.

Penn High School – (*Volleyball player participated in six games in a single session*). Commissioner Cox reported the following action as a result of a violation of Rule 111-4.

1. The Penn High School volleyball program is issued a warning.
2. Coach Sarah Hendricks is reprimanded for permitting this violation to occur. A lack of attentiveness to the rules is not an acceptable explanation for a rules violation.
3. In accordance with rule 3-9 of the IHSAA By-Laws, Michigan City High School must be notified that this violation occurred and the match in which the maximum number of sets was exceeded must be forfeited if Penn was victorious.

Plainfield High School – (*Volleyball player participated in multiple matches without a pre-participation physical and consent form on file*). Commissioner Cox reported the following action as a result of a violation of Rule 3-10.

1. The Plainfield High School volleyball program is issued a warning.
2. Coach Melany Rarey is reprimanded for allowing this violation to occur. This is a health and safety issue and it is absolutely imperative that the “IHSAA Pre-Participation Evaluation Form” complete in every detail be on file for all student athletes prior to their participation in a practice, let alone an interscholastic contest.
3. The contests played in by the ineligible athlete shall be forfeited if Plainfield was victorious and Plainfield shall notify the opponents of this violation.

South Newton High School – (*Volleyball player participated in multiple matches while academically ineligible*). Commissioner Cox reported the following action as a result of a violation of Rule 19-3.

1. The South Newton volleyball program is issued a warning.
2. The student involved in this violation is declared ineligible until such time the student may become academically eligible.
3. The interscholastic contests in which the ineligible athlete participated in shall be forfeited if South Newton was victorious. The opposing schools shall be made aware of this violation.

South Vermillion High School – (*Baseball player participated in multiple matches without an approved transfer report on file*). Commissioner Cox reported the following action as a result of a violation of Rule 19-3.

1. The South Vermillion High School baseball program is issued a warning.
2. The student athlete involved in this violation shall be suspended and declared ineligible until an approved transfer report is on file.
3. The contests in which the ineligible athlete participated shall be forfeited if South Vermillion was victorious. The opposing schools shall be notified of this violation.

Trinity Lutheran High School – (*Student participated in multiple cross country meets without an approved transfer report on file*). Commissioner Cox reported the following action as a result of a violation of Rule 19-3.

1. The Trinity Lutheran High School boys’ cross country program is issued a warning.

2. The student athlete involved in this violation shall be suspended and declared ineligible an approved transfer report is on file.
3. The contests in which the ineligible athlete participated shall be rescored to remove any points earned by the ineligible athlete. The opposing schools shall be notified of this violation.

Wapahani High School – (*Girls’ soccer player participated in multiple soccer matches without an approved transfer report on file*). Commissioner Cox reported the following action as a result of a violation of Rule 19-3.

1. The Wapahani High School girls’ soccer program is issued a warning.
2. The student athlete involved in this violation shall be suspended and declared ineligible until an approved transfer report is on file.
3. The contests in which the ineligible athlete participated shall be forfeited if Wapahani was victorious and the opposing school shall be notified of this violation.

Warsaw High School – (*Football player participated in multiple contests while academically ineligible*). Commissioner Cox reported the following action as a result of a violation of Rule 18-1.

1. The Warsaw Community football program is issued a warning.
2. The student involved in this violation is declared ineligible until such time the student may become academically eligible.
3. The interscholastic contests in which the ineligible athlete participated in shall be forfeited if Warsaw Community was victorious. The opposing schools shall be made aware of this violation.
