Attorney Robert Baker updated the Executive Committee on the current status of pending litigation against the Association.

STUDENT LEADERSHIP CONFERENCE

Assistant Commissioner Searcy presented preliminary plans for the 2015 IHSAA Student Leadership Conference scheduled for June 23, 2015, at Plainfield High School. Information will be disseminated to the membership in April.

LEGISLATIVE UPDATE

Commissioner Cox reported on the bills that have been considered by the legislature.

Senate Bill 119 addressed the date that the required physical must be performed. The bill stated that a physical must be performed within two weeks of a student's birthday, which would create issues for families. Senate Bill 134 speaks to battery of sports officials. It has had its first reading, and no further action has taken place. Senate Bill 403 speaks to coach education involving all sports.

PENALTIES ASSESSED

The following penalties were assessed for various violations of the IHSAA By-Laws:

Andrean High School - Commissioner Cox reported the following action as a result of a violation of Rule 102-3c (*Girls' basketball player participated in more than five quarters in a single session*).

1. The Andrean High School girls' basketball program is issued a warning.
2. All six quarters shall count against the maximum number of quarters allowed for the student athlete involved in this violation.
3. In accordance with Rule 3-9, Knox High School shall be notified of this violation and if Andrean was victorious, the varsity game shall be forfeited.

Blackford High School - Commissioner Cox reported the following action as a result of a violation of Rule 14-1 (*School used an unlicensed official to work a junior varsity boys' basketball game*).

1. The Blackford boys' basketball program is issued a warning.
2. In accordance with Rule 14-1 of the IHSAA By-Laws the contest shall be forfeited if Blackford was victorious and Jay County shall be notified of this violation.

Clinton Prairie High School- Commissioner Cox reported the following action as a result of a violation of Rule 18-1 (*Wrestler participated in an interscholastic meet while academically ineligible*).

1. The Clinton Prairie High School wrestling program is issued a warning.
2. The student involved in this violation is declared ineligible until such time the student may become academically eligible.
3. The interscholastic contest in which the ineligible athlete participated shall be rescored after removing the scores of the ineligible athlete. The opposing schools shall be made aware of this violation.

Corydon Central High School - Commissioner Cox reported the following action as a result of a violation of Rule 14-1(*School used an unlicensed official to work a junior varsity boys' basketball game*).

1. The Corydon Central boys' basketball program is issued a warning.
2. In accordance with Rule 14-1 of the IHSAA By-Laws the contest shall be forfeited if Corydon Central was victorious and Southridge High School shall be notified of this violation.

Corydon Central High School - Commissioner Cox reported the following action as a result of a violation of Rule 14-1(*School used an unlicensed official to work a junior varsity girls' basketball game*).

1. The Corydon Central girls' basketball program is issued a warning.
2. In accordance with Rule 14-1 of the IHSAA By-Laws the contest shall be forfeited if Corydon Central was victorious and Scottsburg High School shall be notified of this violation.

Edgewood High School - Commissioner Cox reported the following action as a result of a violation of Rule 52-3c (*Boys' basketball player participated in more than five quarters in a single session*).

1. The Edgewood High School boys' basketball program is issued a warning.
2. All six quarters shall count against the maximum number of quarters allowed for the student athlete involved in this violation.

3. In accordance with Rule 3-9, South Vermillion High School shall be notified of this violation and if Edgewood was victorious, the varsity game shall be forfeited.

Eminence High School – Commissioner Cox reported the following action as a result of a violation of Rule 19-3 (*Girls' basketball player participated in multiple contests without an approved foreign exchange student eligibility report on file*).

1. The Eminence High School girls' basketball program is issued a warning.
2. The student athlete involved in this violation shall be suspended and declared ineligible until an approved foreign exchange student eligibility report is on file.
3. The contests in which the ineligible athlete participated in shall be forfeited if Eminence was victorious and the opposing schools shall be notified of this violation.

Fort Wayne Canterbury High School - Commissioner Cox reported the following action as a result of a violation of Rule 19-3 (*Boys' swimmer participated in multiple meets without an approved transfer report on file*).

1. The Fort Wayne Canterbury High School boys' swimming and diving program is issued a warning.
2. The student athlete involved in this violation shall be suspended and declared ineligible until an approved transfer report is on file.
3. The contests in which the ineligible athlete participated in shall be rescored after removing the ineligible athlete's scores and the opposing schools shall be notified of this violation.

Fort Wayne Wayne High School - Commissioner Cox reported the following action as a result of a violation of Rule 60-6 (*Wrestling program failed to adhere to the provisions of the Association's wrestling weight management program*).

1. The Fort Wayne Wayne High School wrestling program is issued a warning.
2. Head Coach Josh Grider is reprimanded for committing this violation. Ignorance of the provisions of the weight management program is not an acceptable excuse for a rules violation.

SUSPENSION of remaining regular season contests, SUSPENSION from IHSAA Boys' Basketball Tournament Series and PROBATION for the 2015-16 school year along with financial penalties*).

1. Suspension from Participation in the IHSAA Boys' Basketball Tournament Series.
 - a) Sectional #17 shall be redesigned as a Five-Team Tournament.
 - b) Griffith High School shall receive no sectional tournament revenue from the 2014-15 IHSAA boys' basketball tournament series.
2. Cancellation of Remaining Regular Season Contests – All Levels
 - a) Griffith High School Varsity Schedule
 - i) Feb. 11 at Gary Roosevelt
 - ii) Feb. 12 Calumet
 - iii) Feb. 17 Hammond Noll
 - iv) Feb. 20 at Kankakee Valley
 - v) Feb. 24 Lake Station
 - vi) Feb. 27 at Portage
 - b) For all away varsity contests, Griffith High School shall pay the forfeiture fee of \$500.00 to each hosting school.
 - c) Griffith High School shall inform all remaining opponents at all levels of their forfeitures of these contests. Copies of these written notices shall be forwarded to the IHSAA.
3. The Hammond High School at Griffith High School Boys' Basketball Contest of February 7, 2015 shall stand as a double forfeit.
4. Coach and Student Education Components
 - a) Each basketball coach (paid or voluntary) shall complete the Teaching and Modeling Behavior course found on the nfhslearn.com website. A coach failing to meet this requirement shall not be allowed to coach in an interscholastic contest until fulfillment of this mandate.
 - b) Griffith High School shall produce the certificates of completion for these courses to the Commissioner for inspection.

- c) Each boys' basketball varsity student athlete shall complete the Sportsmanship course found on the nfhslearn.com website. A student athlete failing to meet this requirement shall be ineligible for any interscholastic participation until said requirement is fulfilled.
 - d) Griffith High School shall produce the certificates of completion for these courses to the Commissioner for inspection.
 - a. It is strongly encouraged that all remaining boys' basketball players complete the Sportsmanship course found on the nfhslearn.com website.
5. Probation – The Griffith High School boys' basketball program shall be placed on probation for the entire 2015-16 school year. This probation is a severe type of warning. It is official notice that serious violations have occurred, are a matter of record and future, similar incidents will not be tolerated. Failure to adhere to the stated by-laws of this corporation and/or playing rules provided by the IHSAA and the NFHS may result in additional penalties including but not limited to an entire school suspension of membership from the Indiana High School Athletic Association, Inc.

Hammond High School - Commissioner Cox reported the following action as a result of a violation of Rule 3-6, 8-1 (*Boys' basketball team left the bench area and engaged in physical altercations with opposing team. SUSPENSION of remaining regular season contests, SUSPENSION from IHSAA Boys' Basketball Tournament Series and PROBATION for the 2015-16 school year along with financial penalties*).

1. Suspension from Participation in the IHSAA Boys' Basketball Tournament Series.
 - a) Sectional #17 shall be redesigned as a Five-Team Tournament.

For all away varsity contests, Hammond High School shall pay the forfeiture fee of \$500.00 to each hosting school.

Hammond High School shall inform all remaining opponents at all levels of their forfeitures of these contests. Copies of these written notices shall be forwarded to the IHSAA.
3. The Hammond High School at Griffith High School Boys' Basketball Contest of February 7, 2015 shall stand as a double forfeit.
4. Coach and Student Education Components
 - a) Each basketball coach (paid or voluntary) shall complete the Teaching and Modeling Behavior course found on the nfhslearn.com website. A coach failing to meet this requirement shall not be allowed to coach in an interscholastic contest until fulfillment of this mandate.
 - b) Griffith High School shall produce the certificates of completion for these courses to the Commissioner for inspection.
 - c) Each boys' basketball varsity student athlete shall complete the Sportsmanship course found on the nfhslearn.com website. A student athlete failing to meet this requirement shall be ineligible for any interscholastic participation until said requirement is fulfilled.

 - a. It is strongly encouraged that all remaining boys' basketball players complete the Sportsmanship course found on the nfhslearn.com website.
5. Probation – The Hammond High School boys' basketball program shall be placed on probation for the entire 2015-16 school year. This probation is a severe type of warning. It is official notice that serious violations have occurred, are a matter of record and future, similar incidents will not be tolerated. Failure to adhere to the stated by-laws of this corporation and/or playing rules provided by the IHSAA and the NFHS may result in additional penalties including but not limited to an entire school suspension of membership from the Indiana High School Athletic Association, Inc.

Hebron High School - Commissioner Cox reported the following action as a result of a violation of NFHS Basketball Playing Rules (*Girls' basketball coach refused to substitute for a disqualified player resulting in forfeiture of varsity contest – PROBATION*).

1. The Hebron High School girls' basketball program is placed on probation for the remainder of the 2014-15 season. This probation is a severe type of warning. It is official notice that serious violations have occurred, are a matter of record and future, similar incidents will not be tolerated.
2. Head Coach Douglas Godbolt is reprimanded for his refusal to follow NFHS playing rules in this matter. Ignorance of the playing rules provided by the National Federation is unacceptable. Future and similar acts of defiance with respect to the decisions of contest officials will be handled in the severest of terms.
3. Athletic Director John Steinhilber is reprimanded for interfering with the conduct of an interscholastic contest outside his jurisdiction. Sans an event where the health and safety of participants and spectators is in question, licensed contest officials maintain total control of the contest and shall not be forbidden from executing their contracted duties.
4. The Porter County Conference is strongly encouraged to review their conference rules of play as current conference directives place every school in jeopardy of rules violations. Specifically, the practice of holding eligible players from varsity competition in order to participate in a succeeding junior varsity tournament can only lead to potential violations.
5. As per NFHS rules, the offending team was trailing when the forfeiture occurred. The final result of this contest shall read as follows: South Central 81 Hebron 44 - FORFEIT by Hebron.
6. The administration of Hebron High School is reminded that Rule 9-5 of the IHSAA by-laws provides that the decisions of contest officials are final and binding.

Indianapolis Northwest High School - Commissioner Cox reported the following action as a result of a violation of Rule 12-6 (*Girls' basketball player did not meet all requirements of a virtual school student while participating in interscholastic contests*).

1. The Indianapolis Northwest girls' basketball program is issued a warning.
2. The student athlete involved in this violation is declared ineligible immediately.
3. The contests in which the ineligible athlete participated shall be forfeited if Indianapolis Northwest was victorious. The opposing schools shall be notified of this violation.

LaCrosse High School - Commissioner Cox reported the following action as a result of a violation of NFHS Basketball Playing Rules (*Boys' basketball coach refused to substitute for a disqualified player resulting in forfeiture of varsity contest – PROBATION*).

1. The LaCrosse High School boys' basketball program is placed on probation for the remainder of the 2014-15 season. This probation is a severe type of warning. It is official notice that serious violations have occurred, are a matter of record and future, similar incidents will not be tolerated.
2. Head Coach Jeff Mitzner is reprimanded for his refusal to follow NFHS playing rules in this matter. Ignorance of the playing rules provided by the National Federation is unacceptable. Future and similar acts of defiance with respect to the decisions of contest officials will be handled in the severest of terms.
3. As per NFHS rules, the offending team was trailing when the forfeiture occurred. The final result of this contest shall read as follows: Kouts 55 LaCrosse 39 - FORFEIT by LaCrosse.
4. The administration of LaCrosse High School is reminded that Rule 9-5 of the IHSAA by-laws provides that the decisions of contest officials are final and binding.

McCutcheon High School - Commissioner Cox reported the following action as a result of a violation of Rule 102-3d (*Multiple girls' basketball players participate in more than five quarters in consecutive days of JV and Varsity competition*).

1. The McCutcheon High School girls' basketball program is issued a warning.
2. All six quarters shall count against the maximum number of quarters allowed for the student athletes involved in this violation.
3. In accordance with Rule 3-9, Kokomo High School shall be notified of this violation and if McCutcheon was victorious in the varsity contest where the violation occurred, it shall be forfeited.

Noblesville High School - Commissioner Cox reported the following action as a result of a violation of Rule 15-1.2a (*Three boys' basketball players participated in a recreational league game during the authorized contest season without an approved waiver*).

1. The Noblesville High School boys' basketball program is issued a warning.
2. The eligible students were suspended for one contest by the school. The IHSAA supports this suspension and deems it appropriate and fulfilling for the penalty incurred.

North Decatur High School - Commissioner Cox reported the following action as a result of a violation of Rule 9-13 (*Junior varsity boys' basketball coach conducted open facility opportunities on Sunday*).

1. The North Decatur High School boys' basketball program is issued a warning.
2. Junior Varsity Coach PJ Metz is reprimanded for allowing this violation to occur.
3. Head Varsity Coach Kyle Nobbe is reprimanded for allowing this violation to occur. It is the direct responsibility of the head coach to closely monitor all activities of his program and insure the program is compliant with IHSAA by-laws.
4. The IHSAA accepts the measures taken by the school administration in this matter as appropriate disciplinary actions.

South Bend Riley High School - Commissioner Cox reported the following action as a result of a violation of Rule 18-1 (*Wrestler participated in a junior varsity invitational while academically ineligible*).

1. The South Bend Riley High School wrestling program is issued a warning.
2. The student involved in this violation is declared ineligible until such time the student may become academically eligible.
3. The interscholastic contest in which the ineligible athlete participated shall be rescored after removing the scores of the ineligible athlete. The opposing schools shall be made aware of this violation.

Switzerland County High School - Commissioner Cox reported the following action as a result of a violation of Rule 19-3 (*Girls' swimmer participated in multiple meets without an approved transfer report on file*).

1. The Switzerland County High School girls' swimming and diving program is issued a warning.
2. The student athlete involved in this violation shall be suspended and declared ineligible until an approved transfer report is on file.
3. The contests in which the ineligible athlete participated in shall be rescored after removing the ineligible athlete's scores and the opposing schools shall be notified of this violation.

Twin Lakes High School - Commissioner Cox reported the following action as a result of a violation of Rule 14-1 (*Three boys' basketball players participated in a recreational league game during the authorized contest season without an approved waiver*).

1. The Twin Lakes boys' basketball program is issued a warning.
2. In accordance with Rule 14-1 of the IHSAA By-Laws the contest shall be forfeited if Twin Lakes was victorious and Culver Academy shall be notified of this violation.

Wes-Del High School - Commissioner Cox reported the following action as a result of a violation of Rule 18-1 (*Girls' basketball player participated in an interscholastic contest while academically ineligible*).

1. The Wes-Del High School girls' basketball program is issued a warning.
2. The student involved in this violation is declared ineligible until such time the student may become academically eligible.
3. The interscholastic contest in which this ineligible athlete participated in shall be forfeited if Wes-Del was victorious. The opposing school shall be made aware of this violation.
