CREDENTIALS: The deadline for requests is **Thursday, March 27, 4 pm ET / 3 pm CT**. Credentials will not be granted after that time. For news media outlets intending to cover the boys basketball state finals, please apply for credentials by e-mailing your request (with name of individual applying) to IHSAA Sports Information Director Jason Wille at jwille@ihsaa.org. E-mail requests MUST originate from a recognized business account; e-mails from personal accounts (ie: yahoo.com, aol.com, gmail.com, etc.) will not be accepted. Approved requests will be available for pickup inside the media entrance on game day. Credentials will not be mailed.

MEDIA PARKING: There is no designated parking area for media for this event though there are numerous parking options within a short distance of Bankers Life Fieldhouse. The Virginia Street parking garage, which charges a fee, is directly to the east of the venue.

MEDIA WILL-CALL/ENTRANCE: To gain admittance, the 2013-14 IHSAA Boys Basketball State Finals Media Credential is required. The entrance is on the southeast side of Bankers Life Fieldhouse adjacent to Delaware Street. The door is marked for Employees and Media and is located at the opposite end of the building from the public entrance. Credentials may be claimed beginning at 8 am ET for the first session and at 4 pm ET for the second session. Please have identification available and be prepared to have bags and equipment checked by security officials.

MEDIA WORKROOM: As in previous years, the media workroom at Bankers Life Fieldhouse will be open all day and be available to working media members. The work area contains complimentary wireless internet access and hospitality will be available.

WIRELESS ACCESS: Complimentary wireless service is provided for all attending media. Instructions are posted inside the media workroom. SEAT ASSIGNMENTS: Except where permanent lines have been installed for those that have ordered them, an open seating policy will be used along press row.

RESULTS & STATISTICS: Live stats for each game will be available on the IHSAA website. Stats and box scores will be distributed at halftime and post-game as well as in the media work room.

LOCKER ROOM ACCESS: No one except tournament workers and team members will have access to the inner hallways where locker rooms are located.

NO CHILDREN, PLEASE: With the exception of high school students representing their school's newspaper, yearbook, radio or television station, and who have a team participating, no young people or children will be issued media credentials or be allowed in the working media area.

LIVE TELEVISION CUT-INS: Spot news reports showing live game action is prohibited. Stand-up reports for newscasts are permitted from inside the building provided that no live action is shown.

POST-GAME GUIDELINES

With the exception of the IHSAA's Radio, Television, Internet and Photography partners, all media members are asked to remain off the playing floor and behind the ropes during the post-game awards ceremonies.

The post-game ceremonies order will be as follows:

- Mental Attitude Award presentation
- Runner-Up medals and trophy presentation
- Championship medals and trophy presentation
- Team Photographs by Visual Sports Network

Following the Class A, 2A and 3A awards ceremonies, coaches and selected players will be escorted to the Media Interview Room for a formal press conference which is located on playing floor level just off the media entrance elevator. We ask your assistance to use the press conference as the appropriate time to conduct interviews. The runner-up team coach and selected players will go first followed by the championship team coach and players.

Because of newspaper deadline issues at the end of the 4A contest, no press conference will be scheduled and news media will be allowed to conduct interviews on and around the floor after the awards ceremonies.

- Barr-Reeve chasing first boys basketball state championship and returning to the state finals for second time in five years.
- Vikings have won 17 straight games. Closest game was a nine-point win over conference rival Northeast Dubois for the regional championship on March 15.
- Vikings are the top-rated team in the Associated Press Class A poll and the lead the state in fewest points allowed at 39.9 ppg.
- Team ranks eighth in state in margin of victory defeating opponents by 21.3 ppg. During 16-game win streak, Barr-Reeve has outscored opponents 67.8-41.6 ppg.
- Saturday's game vs. third-ranked Marquette Catholic will be the first ranked team Barr-Reeve has faced this tournament.
- 18-0 vs. other Class A teams, 4-0 vs. 2A teams and 3-0 vs. 3A teams this season. Lone loss this season came to Elizabethtown (Ky.) on Jan. 11.
- In 22 years at Barr-Reeve and 29 overall, coach Bryan Hughes' 497 wins is ninth-most in state history among active coaches.
- Champions of the Blue Chip Conference with an 8-0 record.
- Seeking second state title after volleyball team made history with school's first state championship in any sport on Nov. 9.
