Best Volleyball Teams Converge in Muncie Saturday

The hard-hitting, furious action of the 44th Annual IHSAA Volleyball State Finals will be center stage Saturday including a defending state champion, two more that fell a step short last year and another that has never reached this level of the tournament before.

The four state championship matches begin at 11 am ET at Ball State University's Worthen Arena in Muncie. [Meet the Teams](#)

The opening match of the day is a No. 1 vs. No. 2 matchup featuring Class A top-ranked Lafayette Central Catholic (39-0) and No. 2 Christian Academy of Indiana (28-8), last year's state runner-up.

The Class 2A final calls for No. 5 Wapahani (26-11) to face unranked, surprise entry Speedway (27-9) making its first visit the state championship match.

Another No. 1 vs. No. 2 matchup awaits in Class 3A as top-ranked Yorktown (38-1) will be challenged by No. 2 Providence (36-3), which is playing up a class after winning the last two Class 2A crowns.

The finale in Class 4A pairs No. 6 Carroll (Fort Wayne) (34-3) which will attempt to end the perfect season of top-ranked Indianapolis Cathedral (35-0), also considered the top-ranked team in the country.

All four matches will be televised live by Fox Sports Indiana (FSI) and also available as a live stream at IHSAAtv.org. Greg Rakestraw, Phil Leswing and Mark Jaynes will be the broadcast team for the Class A and 2A matches with Hall of Famer Jerry Baker joining Mike Lingenfelter and Rakestraw for 3A and 4A. Fred Scheub of Merrillville will be honored as Top Volleyball Official

Fred Scheub of Merrillville is the recipient of the 2015 Interscholastic Athletic Officials Association Award for excellence in the sport of volleyball and will be honored in a special ceremony at Saturday's state finals in Muncie.



Each year, the Indiana High School Athletic Association, in cooperation with the National Federation of Interscholastic Officials Association, recognizes and honors an outstanding official in each of 11 sports during the school year.

During his career, Fred has officiated 22 sectionals, 15 regionals, seven semi-states, and four state finals.

Scheub was selected for this honor by a committee representing the officials associations. In Indiana there are 24 associations made up of men and women who assist in providing wholesome, worthwhile, and healthy activities for the student athletes in our state. Statewide, there are more than 8,000 officials licensed by the IHSAA in 11 sports.

A licensed referee for 26 years, Scheub is a member of the Lake County Athletic Officials Association, for whom he has served as a clinician. Fred is also a licensed official in football, basketball, and baseball, and has officiated the state finals for each of his respective sports.

Fred Scheub is a 1972 graduate of Merrillville High School where he competed in the 1971 Cross Country State Finals. He went on to study accounting at Indiana University Northwest and is now a Financial Specialist. Fred has one daughter, Kira (33), and in his free time he speaks at recruiting fairs and is a mentor for the Lake County Athletic Officials Association.

- The last state champion with 40+ victories in a season was the 2009 Muncie Burriss team.
- Knights have defeated two ranked opponents during tournament stretch: #5 Frontier (3-0) in sectional semifinals and #7 Fort Wayne Blackhawk (3-1) for the semi-state championship.
- Have only dropped nine sets all year and three in last 17 matches.

- Four starters return from last year's team which advanced to the sectional championship round in Class 3A.
- School played in Class 3A the last two seasons due to the Tournament Success Factor but has returned to its normal enrollment classification in Class 2A.
- Raiders defeated three top 10 foes during its state tournament run including #1 Wes-Del (3-2) in the opening round of the sectional. Also defeated #6 Madison-Grant (3-1) for the regional crown and #10 Rochester (3-1) for the semi-state title.

- Third appearance ever in a state championship game by a Speedway team and first by a girls team (2001 baseball team finished as 2A state runner-up; 2002 boys basketball team won 2A state title).
- Speedway is the first Marion County public school to play in a volleyball state championship match since 1979 (Ben Davis).
- Four starters return from last year's 26-9 sectional championship team.
- MaxPreps.com named Melanie McHenry to its Preseason All-American Team saying, "One of the most prolific hitters east of the Rockies, McHenry led Speedway to a 26-9 record when she killed 798 (7.1) of her 1,485 attempts. She also had 79 aces, 78 blocks, 415 digs (3.6) and only 13 errors in 496 serve receptions. McHenry, who kicks for her school's football team, has committed to Louisville."
- Sparkplugs have defeated two ranked opponents during state tournament including #8 Covenant Christian (3-1) for the sectional championship and #4 Henryville (3-1) in the South Decatur Semi-State semifinals.
- Their victory over Covenant Christian was their fourth consecutive sectional title, all under fifth year head coach Sadie Dizney.
- Team finished second in the Indiana Crossroads Conference this season with a 6-1 record.
