IHSAAtv.org to host Girls Basketball Semi-State Pairings Show

The 32 girls basketball teams that won regional championships today will learn their semi-state opponents and host sites tomorrow afternoon.

For the first time, the Indiana High School Athletic Association will draw the semi-state pairings live mid-tournament exclusively on [IHSAAtv.org](https://www.IHSAAtv.org). The show, hosted by Greg Rakestraw and Chris May, will begin Sunday (Feb. 12) at 3 pm ET / 2 pm CT.

Semi-state games are scheduled for Saturday, Feb. 18 [at eight different sites](#) with two semi-final games during the day and the championship game in the evening. The winners will advance to their respective state championship games at Gainbridge Fieldhouse in downtown Indianapolis on Saturday, Feb. 25.

To conduct the random drawing for the girls basketball semi-states, Commissioner Paul Neidig will place the four ping-pong balls representing each school in each foursome (Class 1A North, Class 1A South, etc.) into a lottery-style, transparent, air mix machine. The first ball retrieved from the machine will be the visiting team in the first semifinal game with the second ball representing the home team in that game. The third ball to come out is the visitor in the second semifinal game two and the fourth ball the home team in that game. Additionally, the winner of the second semifinal game will be the designated home team in the championship. This same method is used to pair all state tournaments in various sports including the sectional and regional rounds three weeks ago.

About the Indiana High School Athletic Association, Inc. (IHSAA)

The IHSAA is a voluntary, not-for-profit organization that is self-supporting without the use of tax monies. Since its founding in 1903, the Association's mission has been to provide wholesome, educational athletics for the secondary schools of Indiana. Its 407 member high schools - public, institutional, parochial and private - pay no annual membership fee or incur entry fees to play in the Association's tournaments. A state tournament series is conducted annually in 22 sports, 10 for girls, 10 for boys and two co-eds (unified flag football, unified track and field). A 19-person board of directors, elected by member school principals, governs the organization.
