Revised School Enrollments Announced for 2022-23, 2023-24 Team Tournaments

After being made aware of large discrepancies in the enrollment figures for several non-public schools, the IHSAA is releasing a revised edition today of the enrollment totals which will be used in the reclassification and realignment process this spring.

The issue that caused the discrepancies was identified, isolated and corrected with help from the Indiana Department of Education. We apologize for the delay and inconvenience.

Classifications as well as sectional assignments for the 2022-23 and 2023-24 school years will be set and announced later this spring following committee meetings made up of school administrators from around the state. Their final recommendations will be presented to the IHSAA Executive Committee for approval on Tuesday, May 3, 2022.

The enrollment figures, the total of boys and girls in grades 9-12, were submitted by the schools to the Indiana Department of Education and are used to determine the classifications in the sports of baseball, boys and girls basketball, football, boys and girls soccer, softball and volleyball, the next two school years.

Since its founding in 1903, the Association's mission has been to provide wholesome, educational athletics for the secondary schools of Indiana. Its 407 member high schools - public, institutional, parochial and private — pay no annual membership fee or incur entry fees to play in the Association's tournaments. A state tournament series is conducted annually in 22 sports, 10 for girls, 10 for boys and two co-ed (unified flag football and unified track and field). A 19-person board of directors, elected by member school principals, governs the organization.
