Boys Basketball Semi-State Pairings Revealed

The final road to Gainbridge Fieldhouse became clearer today as the 32 remaining teams in the IHSAA Boys Basketball State Tournament learned their opponents and the location of their semistate games. The Indiana High School Athletic Association drew the semi-state pairings live this afternoon on IHSAAtv.org.

Semi-state games are scheduled for next Saturday (March 16) at eight different sites with two semifinal games during the day and the championship game in the evening. The winners advance to their respective state championship games at Gainbridge Fieldhouse in downtown Indianapolis on Saturday, March 30. That date is a week later than normally scheduled due to Gainbridge Fieldhouse hosting the NCAA Men's Basketball First and Second Round Tournament games.

About the Indiana High School Athletic Association, Inc. (IHSAA)

The IHSAA is a voluntary, not-for-profit organization that is self-supporting without the use of tax monies. Since its founding in 1903, the Association's mission has been to provide wholesome, educational athletics for the secondary schools of Indiana. Its 411 member high schools - public, institutional, parochial and private – pay no annual membership fee or incur entry fees to play in the Association's tournaments. A state tournament series is conducted annually in 22 sports, 10 for girls, 10 for boys and two co-eds (unified flag football, unified track and field). A 19-person board of directors, elected by member school principals, governs the organization.
