# 5,000 Meters to a State Championship

One of the most colorful, yet grueling, IHSAA state championship events takes place this Saturday as the top teams and individuals from across the state will meet at the LaVern Gibson Championship Cross Country Course in Terre Haute to determine the 2015 state champions. The boys race begins at 1 pm ET with the girls race to follow at 1:45 pm ET.

Gates to the course will open at 9 am ET / 8 am CT.

Twenty-four full teams and 40 more individuals who qualified without their squad (208 runners each race) will compete in each race over the 5,000 meter course with a reputation as one of the finest in the nation.


Twenty-one of last year's 24 girls teams return including top-ranked and fivetime defending state champion Carmel. Another first-place finish would set a state record for consecutive crowns. Currently, the Greyhounds hold both record strings (1984-1988, 2010-14).

Twelve of last year's top 20 finishers have earned a return trip including semi-state champions Lauren Johnson of West Lafayette and Alex Buck of Pendleton Heights, both of whom won semi-state races last Saturday. Sarah Leinheiser of Carmel and Grace Williams of Bloomington North also won their respective semi-state races and expect to have a say in the outcome.

The list of boys teams competing includes 15 from the 2014 championship meet led by top-ranked Fishers. No. 12 West Lafayette is the defending state champion and returns as a squad for the fourth straight year having won at each stop this tournament.

Carmel's Ben Veatch won his semi-state race last Saturday and returns as the defending state champion after winning last year's title in a photo finish by .07 seconds, the third-closest finish in boys finals history.

Besides Veatch, last year's third place finisher Cooper Williams of West Lafayette returns after winning the semi-state along with Christian Noble of Mt. Vernon (Fortville) who placed 16<sup>th</sup> a year ago. Cameron Trout of Northview is the other semi-state winner.


