TICKETS

PARKING

The entrance to the Virginia Avenue Garage is located off of Maryland Street.

GATES OPEN

Bankers Life Fieldhouse will open its gates to fans beginning one hour prior to the start of each session -- 9:30 am ET and 5 pm ET. The venue will be cleared between the Class 2A and 3A games.

CREDENTIALS: The deadline for requests is **Thursday, March 21, 4 pm ET/3 pm CT**. Credentials will not be granted after that time. For media outlets intending to cover the boys basketball state finals, please apply for credentials by e-mailing your request (with name of individual to be credentialed) to IHSAA Sports Information Director Jason Wille at jwille@ihsaa.org. E-mail requests MUST originate from a recognized business account; e-mails from personal accounts (ie: yahoo.com, gmail.com, etc.) will not be accepted. Please note that the boys basketball state finals require a specific credential. Any passes issued previously will not allow admission to this event. Credentials will not be mailed.

NO CHILDREN, PLEASE: With the exception of high school students representing their school's newspaper, yearbook, radio or television station, and who have a team participating, no young people or children will be issued media credentials or be allowed in the working media area.

MEDIA PARKING: There is no designated parking area for media for this event though there are multiple parking options throughout the downtown area that are within walking distance of the Fieldhouse. The Virginia Avenue Garage, which charges a fee and is located directly to the east of the venue, connects to the Fieldhouse from the third floor of the garage via a walkway over Delaware Street. The entrance to the Virginia Avenue Garage is located off of Maryland Street.

MEDIA WILL-CALL/ENTRANCE: To gain admittance, the 2018-19 IHSAA Boys Basketball State Finals Media Credential is required. The entrance is on the southeast side of Bankers Life Fieldhouse adjacent to Delaware Street. The door is marked for Employees and Media and is located at the opposite end of the building from the public entrance. Credentials may be claimed beginning at 8 am ET for the first session and at 4 pm ET for the second session. Please have identification available and be prepared to have bags and equipment checked by security officials.

MEDIA WORKROOM: The media workroom at Bankers Life Fieldhouse will be open all day and be available to working media members. The work area contains complimentary wireless internet access and hospitality will be available.

SEAT ASSIGNMENTS: Except where permanent lines have been installed for those that have ordered them, an open seating policy will be used along press row.

BROADCAST PHONE LINE (if needed): Phone service is available for installation at each broadcast location. Should your station require such service, please contact Kevin Messenger (kmessenger@pacers.com) for an order form.

FIELDHOUSE WIFI: Complimentary wireless service is provided for all attending media. Please access the "BLF Wifi" wireless signal. No login or password is required. Hard-wired Ethernet lines are available at cost by contacting Kevin Messenger (kmessenger@pacers.com).

RESULTS & STATISTICS: Live stats for each game will be available on the IHSAA website. Stats and box scores will be distributed at the end of each quarter on press row as well as in the media work room.

LOCKER ROOM ACCESS: No one except tournament workers and team coaches and participants will have access to the locker rooms.

LIVE TELEVISION CUT-INS: News reports showing live game action are prohibited. Stand-up reports for newscasts are permitted from inside the building provided that no live action is shown.

POST-GAME GUIDELINES

With the exception of the IHSAA's Radio, Television, Internet and Photography partners, all media members are asked to remain off the playing floor and behind the ropes during the post-game awards ceremonies.

The post-game ceremonies order will be as follows:

- Mental Attitude Award presentation
- Runner-Up medals and trophy presentation
- Championship medals and trophy presentation
- Team Photographs by Double Edge Media

Following the Class A, 2A and 3A awards ceremonies, coaches and selected players will be escorted to the Media Interview Room for a formal press conference which is located on playing floor level just off the media entrance elevator. We ask your assistance to use the press conference as the appropriate time to conduct interviews. The runner-up team's coach and selected players will go first followed by the championship team's coach and players.

Because of newspaper deadlines at the end of the 4A contest, no press conference will be scheduled and news media will be allowed to conduct interviews on and around the floor after the awards ceremonies.



**LEE LONZO NAMED
RICHARD G. LUGAR AWARD RECIPIENT**

Lee Lonzo, the Director of Champions Together, is this year's recipient of the Richard G. Lugar Award for Distinguished Service to Interscholastic Athletics.

At halftime of the 4A state championship game on Saturday night, IHSAA Commissioner Bobby Cox, Jim Morris, Vice Chairman of Pacers Sports and Entertainment, and Governor Eric Holcomb will present the award to Lonzo.



A former teacher, coach, athletic director and assistant principal at Carmel High School, Lonzo served on the IHSAA Board of Directors and assisted in the formation of its Student Advisory Committee. As an Educational Consultant with the IHSAA, Lee works closely with Assistant Commissioners Kerrie Schludecker and Robert Faulkens in helping with the IHSAA Student Leadership Conference. He has been instrumental in the partnership between Special Olympics Indiana and the IHSAA.

Through the Champions Together Program, the IHSAA and Special Olympics Indiana have implemented Unified Sports high school state championships in flag football, track and field, bowling and bocce which brings together students with and without intellectual disabilities to represent their high school in sports competition. Lonzo has also conducted the Unified Champions School banner program achieved by 125 IHSAA member schools. His work to create Unified Sports as recognized IHSAA sports has spearheaded the Inclusion Revolution in so many member schools.

Former recipients of this award include Senator Richard Lugar and former Executive Director of the National Federation of State High School Associations, Bob Gardner. On behalf of all 410 member schools across the state of Indiana, we thank you Mr. Lonzo for your years of dedicated service to high school sports and we're pleased to honor you with the Richard G. Lugar Award for Distinguished Service to Interscholastic Athletics!

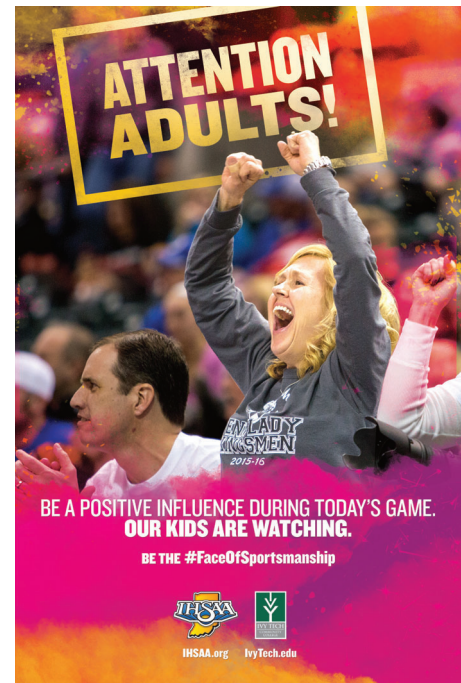
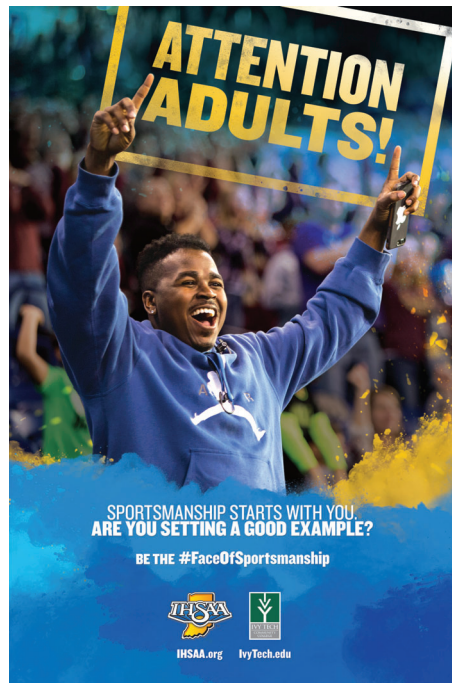

TERRE HAUTE'S PJ PITTS TO BE HONORED AS BASKETBALL'S OUTSTANDING OFFICIAL

Each year, the Indiana High School Athletic Association honors an outstanding official in each sport during the state final tournament.

PJ Pitts of Terre Haute is the recipient of the 2018-19 IHSAA Outstanding Basketball Official Award. PJ has been a licensed basketball official for the past 22 years and is a member of the Wabash Valley Officials Association for which he serves as the Assistant Basketball Chairperson.



During his career, he's officiated 15 basketball sectionals, 11 regionals, eight (8) semi-states, and three (3) state finals. In addition, Pitts is a licensed football and volleyball official, and he has worked three girls basketball state finals and one football state championship game.

PJ was selected for this honor by a committee representing the officials associations. In Indiana, there are 24 associations made up of more than 7,000 men and women who assist in providing wholesome, worthwhile, and healthy activities for the student-athletes in our state. Statewide, there are more than 8,000 officials licensed by the IHSAA in 11 sports.

A 1994 graduate of West Vigo High School, PJ is an Operations Manager at Heavy Duty Truck in Terre Haute. He is very active in his community, volunteering his time for the West Terre Haute Brush Up, Clean Up the Community Environmental Day for the last 13 years. PJ and his wife, Ashley, have been married for eight years. He has five children – Alexia (14), Kayleigh (12), McKenzie (10), Jackson (7), and Ryleigh (5).

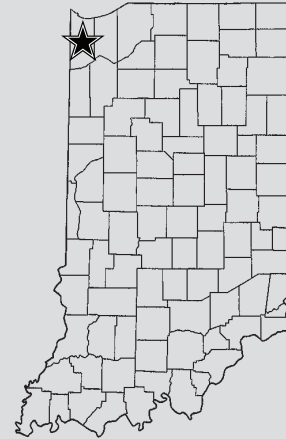

ARTHUR L. TRESTER & RAY CRAFT MENTAL ATTITUDE AWARD RECIPIENTS

The IHSAA Executive Committee presents the Arthur L. Trestler & Ray Craft Mental Attitude Awards to the outstanding senior participant in each classification of the boys' basketball state finals. The recipients of these awards, who were nominated by their principals and coaches, must excel in mental attitude, scholarship, leadership and athletic ability in basketball. The Indiana Pacers and Indiana Fever, the presenting sponsors of the state tournament, donate a \$1,000 scholarship to each school in the name of the recipient.

The 4A, 3A and 2A awards are named in honor of the late Arthur L. Trestler who served as first commissioner of the Association from 1929 to 1944. Trestler helped Indiana high school sports and the IHSAA emerge from the Great Depression in a position of preeminence unmatched by perhaps any other state in the nation.

Beginning in 2016, the Class A award was re-named in honor of Ray Craft, the long-time associate commissioner who served from 1983 to 2008. Craft was involved at nearly every level of Indiana secondary education and interscholastic athletics during his career including administering the boys basketball state tournament for many years. He was also a starting senior guard on Milan High School's 1954 state championship basketball team.

From 1917 to 1943 the award was known as "The Gimbel Medal for Mental Attitude" in honor of Mr. Jake Gimbel of Vincennes, who awarded the medal each of those years until his passing prior to the 1943 tournament. In 1944, the award became known as the "IHSAA Medal for Mental Attitude". In 1945, the IHSAA Board officially named the award "The Arthur L. Trestler Medal for Mental Attitude".

Recipients were given a medal each year from 1945 through 1964, hence "The Arthur L. Trestler Medal for Mental Attitude." Since 1965, the award has been made in the form of a plaque with a copy of the original medal incorporated on the face of the plaque, hence "The Arthur L. Trestler Award for Mental Attitude."
